- A. A modified graduation due to the COVID 19 pandemic will be held on May 18, 20, 21 and 22, 2020 in the Allen East gymnasium. The superintendent recommends the Allen East Board of Education accept the graduating Class of 2020 upon completion of all necessary requirements. The members of the class are as presented.
- B. Contract with the West Central Ohio Assistive Technology Center to aid with the purchase of a special-needs device for the 2020-2021 school year.
- C. Partnership agreement with University of Northwestern Ohio (UNOH) for college credit plus for the 2020-2021 school year.
- D. Enter into a contract with the Allen County Educational Service Center for special education and alternative school services for the 2020-2021 fiscal year at a cost of \$528,107.90 (prior year \$476,309.00).
- E. Recognition of the following district support organizations for the 2020-2021 school year:
  - a. Allen East Youth Sports Alliance
  - b. Allen East Music Association
  - c. Allen East Mom's and Dad's Club
  - d. Allen East Mustang Wrestling Club

With each organization being responsible for following Allen East Board Policy 9211 whereas:

School employees and Board-approved school volunteers may not be directly compensated in any manner by District support organizations.

- It shall be the responsibility of each District support organization to monitor its activities to assure compliance with Board Policy.
- The organization shall permit the Board to review all financial books and documentation upon request, and shall conduct a financial audit upon request of the Board. In addition, organizations must produce the following documents to the Superintendent and/or Treasurer upon request:
  - A determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service that verifies the organization is a tax-exempt organization in good standing as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (if applicable).
  - A copy of the support organization's Bylaws and any amendments are on file with the Treasurer.
  - A current list of names, addresses and titles of each officer of the organization. No administrative employee of the School District may be an officer of the booster organization in order for the organization to obtain Board recognition.
  - A description of the projects or activities the organization intends to undertake during the ensuing school year and the objective and goals of such projects or activities.
- ➤ Donations from District support organizations must be made in accordance with Board Policy 7230 and any accompanying guidelines. Donations shall become the property of the Board and used in a manner determined by the Board, in accordance with its policies and administrative guidelines.
- The activities of District support organizations shall not involve the use of public funds and the District shall not assume responsibility for any purchases made on behalf of any support organization governed by this policy. The school district tax identification number shall not be used for District support organization purchases.
- Each District support organization must abide by the policies and guidelines established for the use of District facilities and grounds. Projects that require any modification or alteration to District property must be pre-approved by the Superintendent.

	WHEREAS, the Board desires to make such an election for the 2019-2020 school year.
	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board finds that it would be impossible or impracticable to conduct evaluations of teachers pursuant to Chapter 3319 of the Ohio Revised Code for the 2019-2020 school year if said evaluations were not completed prior to the Ohio Director of Health's Order on March 14, 2020, ordering the closure of K-12 schools in Ohio;
	BE IT RESOLVED that the Board elects not to conduct evaluations under Chapter 3319 of the Ohio Revised Code for teachers during the 2019-20 school year, to the extent that such evaluations were not completed prior to March 14, 2020
	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board in collaboration with the Allen East Education Association extend the implementation of OTES 2.0 until the 2021-2022 school year.

	The superintendent recommends the Allen East Board of Education approve a one-year (July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021) collective bargaining contract with the Allen East Education Association for the 2020-2021 school year. There are no language changes with 0% on the base and a \$1,300 stipend for members not receiving salary steps.

16.	MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE ALLEN EAST EDUCATION ASSOCIATION AND THE ALLEN EAST BOARD OF EDUCATION: (#)
	The superintendent recommends the Allen East Board of Education approve a memorandum of understanding with the Allen East Education Association with the following terms:

- Any collective bargaining unit member who was missing an evaluation component required by the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) and the Ohio Revised Code on March 16, 2020 shall be considered to have an incomplete evaluation for the 2019-2020 school year.
- Any bargaining unit member with and incomplete evaluation during the 2019-2020 school year shall be subject to a complete evaluation cycle during the 2020-2021 school year, in compliance with the

requirements of the CBA and the Ohio Revised Code. The student growth measurer for all OTES 1.0 teachers may pull forward for the 2020-2021 school year.

- Any bargaining unit member who had an incomplete evaluation shall retain their previous evaluation rating until they have completed a full evaluation cycle, as defined by the CBA and Ohio Revised Code.
- No bargaining unit member may be nonrenewed, or placed on an improvement plan due to an incomplete
  evaluation for the 2019-2020 school year. Any bargaining unit member who is currently on an
  improvement plan from 2018-2019 school year may pull forward for year 2020-2021.
- Any collective bargaining unit member whose evaluation cycle contained all the components required by the CBA and Ohio Revised Code, as it existed on March 16, 2020 may, at the employee's option, be considered a complete evaluation. The employee shall not be subject to an evaluation in the 2020-2021 school year, except as required by the CBA or Ohio Revised Code. Should the employee choose to consider their evaluation cycle complete, the Board retains its right make employment decisions using the summative evaluation rating, pursuant to the terms of the CBA and the Ohio Revise Code, and shall do so no later than June 1, 2020.
- The Board and Association agree to extend the implementation of OTES 2.0 until the 2021-2022 school
  year. The terms and conditions of employment and/or the modification or deletion of current CBA
  provisions impacted by the implementation of OTES 2.0 shall remain a subject of negotiation between the
  Board and Association.

  - 2. An unanimous quorum of the Board or its subcommittee determines, by a roll call vote, that the executive session is necessary to protect the interests of the applicant or the possible investment or expenditure of public funds to be made in connection with the economic development project.
